The **Yule Month** is probably one of the most known months. One of Odin's many names is Jólnir which comes from the word Jól which means he is associated with this month. This is also the time of year was Odin is traveling around Midgard more than usual visiting the locals. The children will fill socks with hay for his horse Sleipnir, and Odin might give them a small gift in return. The Yule month is also connected with fertility and according to the folklore it was linked to earth cultivation.

Thorri is when the feast **Torrablot** is held. The night before the **Thorri** month begins, the woman of the house will walk outside and welcome Thorri (the Winter Spirit) inside as a guest. This month is also the month of the men, and any man could choose a day to be celebrated, but if he chooses a day that had bad weather, it could be seen as a warning for him, for things to come.

The feast of Torrablot necessitates an iron stomach. Unless dishes like sheep heads, rotten shark, ram testicles, meat jelly made with meat from a lamb's head, sounds like a lovely meal.

Everything, of course, washed down with the seasonal Thorri beer and many shots of **brennivín** also known as **black death**.

A Norse-Saxon campaign by Tom Fisher. Set in New Caledonia, our intrepid Njord and Sax Adventurers thrust themselves into the undiscovered countryside to make their fortunes and names in this brave new world.

Beginning in 1592, our party has journeyed across the Atlantan Sea setting foot in the port city of Haligon. the free City-State is the first foothold for many a determined merchant and daring explorer who come to the New World. A glowing beacon of civilization, Haligon holds the promise of riches beyond measure for those hardy enough to brave the wilderness beyond its walls, and return with all manner of new resources to sell the shipping barons who are eager to make profit in the Old world.

The lands beyond Haligon's gates are wild and begging to be tamed. Brave folk have set out with some success against the hard wilderness, establishing sparse trading outposts, with strong new Eørles laying claim to lands they defend with sword and axe, for beyond the walls of Haligon, the only laws are the laws of the gods, the laws of nature, and the laws of the strongest. Do well by an Eørle and you may be favoured with riches, cross an Eørle and you may find yourself hunted, and good luck determining what piece of land "belongs" to whom. Ownership in New Caledonia is measured solely by one's ability to hold on to one's claim, by cunning guile, by wiley diplomacy, or by deadly force.

Of course, the Njords and Saxs are not the only inhabitants of New Caledonia. Others have come seeking their glory, from all over the Old World, Francs and Berbers, Huns and Ibericans, they, too, seek their fortunes. But New Caledonia is only new to those of the Old World. Across the land, savage, Skraal marauders have been hunting the good and hardy settlers of the New World. Disappearing into the forest from whence they magically appear, these inhuman savages prey upon settlements. Beasts of all manner, from the natural to the horridly arcane stalk the wildlands between defended Eørldoms and strongholds. Those left underdefended find themselves overtaken by beast or savage quickly enough.

Of course, where there is danger there is opportunity, and wonder. Those brave enough to sally forth beyond defended lands, and lucky enough to return tell wonderful tales of astounding beauty, and warn of even greater dangers the deeper one ventures into the New World. Ancient Ruins lay waiting in the darkest pockets of the forests, forgotten by time and history, but none who have entered have ever returned.

Great adventure awaits those daring and bold enough to brave the New World's dangers. Who will take up adventure's call to write their own fate and claim land and riches for themselves? The bold will surely succeed, but should they not, there *is* always Valhalla...
